Section 6 - Coulsdon South to Banstead Downs

5 miles

Locations: Banstead Downs, Eleanor's Cross, Belmont, Clapham, Clapham Park, Clapham Common, Tooting Common, Furzedown, Streatham Park, Streatham Vale, Streatham Common, Mitcham, St Helier, The Wrythe, Hackbridge, Wallington, Carshalton on the Hill, Carshalton Beeches, South Beddington, Mitcham Common, Pollards Hill, Lambeth, Little Woodcote and Woodcote Green.

The prayer walk goes through the two boroughs of Croydon and Sutton. Other boroughs to pray for are Merton, Wandsworth, Lambeth and City of Westminster.
